

Loved and were loved, and now we lie, In Flanders fields.



Our May speaker is Dana Palmer-Buckeye Research: Using Family Search to Find Ohio Records

Dana Palmer, CG, CGL has been a genealogy instructor at Sinclair Community College since 2010. She has spoken at national, state, and local genealogy events and conferences including RootsTech, NGS, FGS, and frequently at OGS. She specializes in lineage society applications, publishing family books, Midwestern research specifically Ohio, but she also has experience in Germany, Denmark, and the U.K. She also reviews military repatriation cases and is part of the Mayflower Silver books team. She has received numerous awards for her books and volunteer efforts. She belongs to several lineage societies including ISDUP, USDAR, USD 1812, and Colonial Dames. She loves

problem solving and tracking down those elusive ancestors.



Beth Sanders is our June speaker.

Beth Sanders is a local entrepreneur that helps people tell their life stories, through her company, LifeBio. In 2020, the company also rolled out a service called MyHello that connects people by phone for social engagement. Beth's family tree goes back to the Mayflower and Revolutionary War days. Through some of her father's life story and the rocky road her family trod, she will share some of her own legacy and why it matters so deeply to her to help others tap into their own incredible backgrounds and genealogies. She will also share some practical examples of how LifeBio helps those who are

seeking support and affordable ways to write a book for their own family.

Our next meeting will be on May 20 and our speaker will be Dana Palmer on "Using FamilySearch to find Ohio Records". Lynn then introduced our speaker for the day, John Lambert assisted by his wife Mary Ann on "Labor Saving Devices of 1800's"

John has been collecting items that were patented from the 1860's through the early 1900's. He



demonstrated a popcorn popper with gears, several ice cream scoopers, an agitator for washing clothes in a tub, nutmeg graters, cherry pitters, can openers, lemon squeezer, raisin pitter to remove the seeds from grapes, an egg candler, egg beaters and several different types of apple peelers.
